- 1. Equestrian Events—II Kings 2:11. You have to admit, Elijah going up into Heaven in a whirlwind of fiery horses and chariots out does any event I have ever watched. I vote that a standing world record.
- 2. Swimming—II Kings 6:6. Elisha threw a stick into the water and made an iron axe head "swim" (KJV). I'll grant you that speed in the water may not have been the primary miracle here.
- 3. Weight Lifting—Judges 16:3. A city gate, with frame and posts and all has to weigh a ton—literally! Samson not only clean and jerked them, He carried them for miles.

- 7. Marathon—I Kings 18:46. Elijah's time wasn't technically recorded, but he outran specially bred chariot horses over a course nearly the length of the standard marathon. That is impressive.
- 8. Rowing—John 6:21. Okay, I'll give you the technical side of this that they didn't row the distance. But they had gone 3-4 miles out to sea, about half way, and immediately reached shore after taking Jesus aboard. That's really fast.
- 9. Marksmanship—Judges 20:16. I know, no bullets, but slinging a stone with that kind of accuracy is pretty amazing.
